## Chain-Making Workshop

**Hours 9:00-3:00**

You will learn the basics of metalworking with an emphasis on chain making. We will make simple loop chains, chain mail, beaded chains, and much more! You will also learn refinishing skills such as sawing, sanding, filing, and polishing, along with soldering skills using an acetylene torch. This concentrated time is similar to a college studio art class. The instructor has a BFA in jewelry design from Parsons School of Design and has worked for a jeweler on Madison Avenue in New York City. Leader: Gloria Greene

## Thinking Like a Lawyer Workshop

**Hours 9:00-3:00**

Have you ever wondered how lawyers and judges make decisions? What does it mean to think like a lawyer? In this workshop we will explore some of the central elements of legal reasoning. In addition to breaking down complicated questions into basic parts, thinking like a lawyer means approaching and solving problems in a particular way. Central to this approach to problem-solving is what we might call “Sesame Street® logic”: one of these is not like the others. Join us as we explore the law through group discussion, simulations, role playing, cases, and sessions with people who spend their time thinking like a lawyer. Leader: Barry Sharpe, Ph.D., J.D.

## Ethical Leadership Workshop

**Hours 9:00-3:00**

What is leadership? What is ethics? What is ethical leadership? Leadership and ethics begin with knowing yourself, involve goals and goal-setting, and require the evaluation of how to reach goals. Join us as we explore what it takes to be a leader, examine leadership traits and leadership styles, and consider the relationship between ethics and leadership.
